NVQ Level 2 in Wood Occupations

Course Duration: 1 Year

Course Outline

This course is aimed at candidates who are already in appropriate employment within the wood occupations sector. The course is based within the work place where assessment will take place, but learners may have to attend College for training sessions and building a portfolio. This will be agreed with the candidate at interview. Successful completion of this course is one of the entry requirements for progression onto the equivalent Level 3 course.

Course Content

The following mandatory units will be studied:

- Conform to General Workplace Safety
- Conform to Efficient Working Practices
- Move and Handle Resources

In addition, three optional units must be undertaken from the following:

- Install First Fixing Components
- Install Second Fixing Components
- Erect Structural Carcassing Components
- Maintain Non-structural Carpentry Work
- Set Up and Use Circular Saws

Assessment

Assessment of this qualification will be by observation in the work place and the building of a portfolio of evidence.

Entry Requirements

Learners must:

- Be in suitable full time employment
- Have achieved GCSE's at Grade E or above In Maths and English Language or have achieved at least Level 1 in Numeracy and Literacy, as well as a good level of dictation in a College based Initial Assessment process
- Achieved at least 80% attendance in any previous College based course
- Be able to demonstrate a conscientious attitude and interest in motor vehicle studies at interview
- Undertake appropriate additional support should this be required
- Provide their own substantial footwear and overalls in the work place
