City & Guilds 6129 Certificate in Plumbing Studies: Level 3 (Ref: T81)

Course Duration: 1½ Years
Part Time: 1 day per week

Course Outline

This course is aimed at learners who wish to continue to progress to a higher level within the plumbing industry. Please note, if you are employed in the plumbing industry the C & G 6089 NVQ Level 3 (See separate leaflet) work based activity can be undertaken in conjunction with this C & G 6129 Certificate – at an additional cost. Achievement in both these qualifications will lead to a full “industry standard” Level 3 plumbing qualification.

Course Content

The course covers technical knowledge and practical skills. The theory content is approximately 75% and the practical elements approximately 25%. Our well equipped workshops provide a realistic working environment.

The course consists of the following units:

- 300 System Planning
- 301 Cold Water Systems
- 302 Hot Water Systems including Un-vented
- 303 Above Ground Discharge Pipework Systems
- 304 Central Heating Systems Including Boilers & Controls
- 305 Gas Supply Systems (Part 1 & 2)
- 306 Improvement of Business Products and Services

Please note: that for Gas – Accreditation Certification Scheme (ACS), Water Regulations and Un-Vented Hot Water Storage Systems, are not mandatory requirements of this qualification.

Assessment

Assessment of knowledge takes the form of a multiple choice examination. At the end of each Unit 301 – 306, Unit 300 is system design exam. In addition, practical assessments are also undertaken.

Entry Requirements

Learners must:

- Have completed a Level 2 plumbing programme C & G 6129 and also the C & G 6089 NVQ Level 2.
- Be able to demonstrate a conscientious attitude and interest in plumbing installation work at interview.
- Have achieved at least 80% attendance in any previous College based course
- Undertake additional support should this be required
- Provide their own substantial footwear and overalls, which must be worn at all times when undertaking practical activities. Other materials should also be provided by the learner including associated books, pens, paper, files etc.
