Construction Plant Maintenance Advanced Apprenticeship Framework - Level 3

Course Duration: The course is a progression route from the L2 Apprenticeship and is a one year duration. It consists of 12 weeks at 30 hours per week, usually divided into four x 3 week blocks spread throughout the year

Part time Work based

The Advanced Apprenticeship Framework Course Content

The Level 3 content covers inspection, testing, fault diagnosis, overhaul and repair of construction plant equipment. It covers the following topics:

- Engines
- Transmissions
- Hydraulics
- Pneumatics
- Vehicle electrics/electronics
- Braking systems
- Advanced systems

Typical weekly timetable

- One full days practical working on plant equipment
- Half day key skills and NVQ portfolio building
- Three full days underpinning knowledge

Those successfully completing the Advanced Apprenticeship Framework at Level 3 will be regarded as highly skilled mechanics. This status invites the prospects of becoming workshop or field based service engineers working on own initiative

Funding

Candidates aged between 16 and 18 will be eligible for free registration and training

Candidates aged 19+ before 31 August 2009 will be eligible for free training.

Registration, examination and certification fees would be charged at £250. If a candidate has completed a Level 2 in Construction Plant Maintenance at Stafford College in 08/09 then the £250 will be waived

Accommodation, meal allowances, travel expenses and wages are the responsibility of the employer and apprentice candidate
