Course Outline

The course aims to give the student a thorough knowledge of the theory and practice of Reflexology. The successful student will be awarded with a nationally recognised qualification. Home study is **essential**. Anatomy and Physiology Diploma and D1120 to be studied alongside.

The facilities available on site are of an excellent standard.

Course Content

- Theory and practice of all aspects of foot reflexology treatment
- Employment Standards for salon administration and practice
- Client treatments and case studies
- Consultation skills

Case studies are an essential part of the criteria for the course and while Stafford College will endeavour to get clients it is ultimately the student's responsibility to ensure they have enough clients to cover this. The salons are run as in industry and as such clients have to pay for treatments.

All the above are subject to VTCT amendments.

Assessment

A portfolio of evidence will be collected by the student for assessment. This will consist of written, oral and observed practical evidence. Independent assessments set by awarding body.

Entry Requirements

- There are no formal entry requirements, although a background knowledge of anatomy would be an advantage.
- Students should preferably be over 18 years of age.
- Diploma in Anatomy & Physiology and D1120 must be studied alongside or previously gained
