NVQ Level 3 in Wood Occupations (Ref: T5)

Course Duration: 1 Year
Part Time: See course outline below.

Course Outline

This course is aimed at candidates who are already in appropriate employment within the wood occupations sector. The course is based within the work place where assessment will take place, but learners may have to attend College for training sessions and building a portfolio. This will be agreed with the candidate at interview.

Course Content

The following mandatory units will be studied:

- VR01 Conform to General Workplace Safety
- VR209 Confirm Work Activities and Resources for the Work
- VR210 Develop and Maintain Good Working Relationships
- VR211 Confirm the Occupational Method of Work
- VR09 Install First Fixing Components
- VR10 Install Second Fixing Components

In addition, two optional units must be undertaken from the following:

- VR11 Erect Structural Carcassing Components
- VR24 Erect Complex Structural Carcassing Components
- VR25 Maintain Non-Structural and Structural Components
- VR26 Set Up and Use Fixed or Transportable Machinery

Assessment

Assessment of this qualification will be by observation in the work place and the building of a portfolio of evidence.

Entry Requirements

Learners must:

- Have achieved NVQ Level 2 in Wood Occupations
- Be in suitable full time employment
- Have achieved GCSE's at Grade D or above in Maths and English Language or have achieved at least Level 2 in Numeracy and Literacy, as well as a good level of dictation in a College based Initial Assessment process
- Achieved at least 80% attendance in any previous College based course
- Be able to demonstrate a conscientious attitude and interest in motor vehicle studies at interview
- Undertake appropriate additional support should this be required
- Provide their own substantial footwear and overalls in the work place
